One road, one name: Veterans Parkway

► Fourth Avenue, North Expressway, Beallwood Connector and Hamilton Road will be replaced with name that was overwhelming favorite of residents who responded to a renaming campaign

The Columbus street with an identity crisis finally has a name that promises to stick: Veterans Parkway.

In 1937, the Columbus thoroughfare running from Fourth Street to the Harris County line was named the Tennessee-Columbus Military Highway. In 1952 it was named again as the Martha Berry Highway, after the first woman to serve on the state Board of Regents.

In the years after that it evolved into a four-name corridor: Fourth Avenue, North Expressway, Beallwood Connector and Hamilton Road.

Then last year it got one uniform, new name: Olympic Boulevard. But the word Olympic is a protected trademark, so that name had to be tossed aside.

-Now, after months of debate and a public campaign to rename the road, the road name has been changed to Veterans Parkway. Columbus councilors unanimously passed a measure Tuesday that makes the change official.


"It's really encouraging to know the people in Columbus have the patriotism to support the sacrifices and achievements of all veterans," said Jim Rhodes.

a local activist for veterans' affairs who strongly pushed the Veterans Parkway name. "The veterans have been here foryears and years and make up one-third of the population in Columbus."

The council vote followed the release of an informal survey showing that Veterans Parkway was the overwhelming favorite of residents who responded to a renaming campaign that ran May 25 through Monday.

City officials offered seven names in their campaign, but Veterans Parkway





"We are convinced that in the leadership of Bosnian Serbs, there is a positive atmosphere concerning the international community and that they are' ready to act in the direction of peace," Stanisic said.

Milosevic has been considered key in persuading intransigent Serb leaders in Bosnia to release peacekeepers, seized after NATO warplanes bombed Serb ammunition dumps May 25 and 26.

The Bosnian Serbs released 121 peacekeepers on Friday after intervention by Stanisic. After Wednesday's release, 148 remained in Serb captivity, and Stanisic said he was hopeful more would be released soon.

The Bosnian Serbs seized hundreds of U.N. hostages after the NATO air raids and initially demanded guarantees of no more NATO air strikes before agreeing to release any of them. It was unclear early Wednesday if such a guarantee had been given. .

Asked whether the Bosnian Serbs had received anything in return for the release of the hostages, Stanisic replied: "I can't answer that. Our only task is to help in this crisis."

But Belgrade's independent BETA news agency quoted an unnamed high-ranking Bosnian Serb as saying they had received assurances from NATO that there would be no more air raids - a key condition the West has refused to consider to date.

The negotiations about the hostages have involved an American envoy, top Greek offi-

cials, Bosnian Serb leaders and Milosevic.

In Washington, State Department spokeswoman Christine Shelly said Milosevic helped with the hostage situation but showed no interest in a proposal that he recognize Bosnia in exchange for a suspension of U.N. economic sanctions.

Milosevic's recognition of Bosnia would further isolate rebel Serbs in Bosnia and Croatia and undermine their dream of uniting territories they hold with Serbia itself

Milosevic insists on an ironclad lifting of economic sanctions against his nation. Washington, however, wants to be able to reintroduce them if necessary

The White House welcomed the news but noted other hostages remained. "They're still short," press secretary Mike McCurry said.

In London, Bosnia's foreign minister, Muhamed Sacirbey, complained Tuesday that Western governments were more concerned about the peacekeepers than the civilians who have been under Serb siege for more than three years.

Fighting continued Tuesday amid the diplomatic maneuvering. Two civilians were killed and one wounded when five shells hit the northwestern Bosnian city of Bihac, a U.N.-declared "safe area."

Meanwhile, about 1,500 U.S. troops and attack helicopters were preparing to move from Germany to Italy, and world leaders debated the role of a rapid deployment force of up to 10,000 troops being assembled by Britain and France.

The U.S. troops and helicopters will train in Italy to ensure "they are on the razor's edge of readiness," said U.S. Army-Europe spokesman Col. Richard Bridges in Heidelberg, Germany. The units being deployed can help withdraw or reposition U.N. peacekeepers in Bosnia.

Doctor: 'Cancer destiny' can be determined

▶ Geneticist and cancer specialist tells audience of local doctors of the benefits and drawbacks of genetic testing

Imagine your doctor could tell you while you are very young that you are predisposed to a type of cancer known to be hereditary — 'say cancer of the

breast, ovaries or colon. You could then take preventive measures to avoid certain cancers.

The technology is here now; through molecular genetics, a person's "cancer destiny" can be determined, even before birth, according to Dr.



mined, even before Lynch birth, according to Dr. Henry T. Lynch, professor of medicine and chairman of the Department of Preventive Medicine,

Creighton University School of Medicine, and director of the Creighton Cancer Center, in Omaha, Neb.

But Lynch said the medical ethics to accompany the technology are still being developed.


Lynch, a geneticist and cancer specialist for whom the "Lynch syndromes" are named, spoke to about 100 doctors and nurses. Tuesday night in Columbus as part of an educational oncology seminar series sponsored by the John B. Amos Community Cancer Center at The Medical Center.

"There are practical ways to help patients through molecular genetics," Lynch told the group of mostly primary care physicians, obstetrician/gynecologists and surgeons. Because the field is still developing, there are "no guidelines, there's no ethical backup" for the ability to do the testing, Lynch said, cautioning against indiscriminate genetic testing.

Genetic testing aside, doctors need to take detailed family histories of patients to determine a cancer predisposition,
